Bishop's Bio

Bishop Stafford J.N. Wicker holds an esteemed position in the African Methodist Episcopal Church as the 137th elected and consecrated Bishop. His leadership, and ministerial impact alongside Supervisor Constance Belin Wicker, is distinguished by his strong advocacy for social justice, economic empowerment, and commitment to professional development.

Bishop Wicker's journey in the ministry began with an education rooted in faith and service. He holds a Bachelor of Arts from Wilberforce University, followed by a Master of Divinity and Doctor of Divinity from Turner Theological Seminary. His doctoral research was focused on engaging local A.M.E. Church congregations with HIV/AIDS education and prevention, illustrating his dedication to community service and health awareness.

Upon his graduation in 1982, Bishop Wicker received his first pastoral appointment at Turner Chapel A.M.E. Church in Roseland, LA, from Bishop Donald George Kenneth Ming. His leadership was marked by growth and development, with a new church being constructed under his guidance. In 1985, Bishop Wicker married the love of his life, Constance Belin of Baton Rouge, Louisiana. From there, their ministerial journey included assignments in Georgia, where he led the congregations of the Toomsboro Circuit, Mt. Zion A.M.E. Church in Mansfield, and Mt. Carmel A.M.E. Church in Atlanta. At each stop, then Pastor Wicker demonstrated a commitment to financial stewardship and congregational growth, helping to eliminate debt, increase membership, and enhance facilities.

Bishop Wicker's tenure at Antioch A.M.E. Church in Decatur, GA, marked a significant turning point in his career.

Under his leadership, the church congregation expanded significantly, and the church campus in Stone Mountain became the largest A.M.E. church acquisition at the time.

Bishop's vision for community upliftment led to the development of the Antioch Community Development Corporation in 1998. The organization was formed with the objective of fostering economic and community development in Georgia. Bishop Wicker's strategic leadership led to the acquisition of additional lands, the establishment of Antioch Manor Estates, Antioch Gardens and Villas, and plans for the development of Antioch Summits. These ambitious projects have increased the church's portfolio to an impressive 84 acres of land, valued at \$48 million.


During the 50th Session of the African Methodist Episcopal Church's General Conference, Bishop and Supervisor Wicker were assigned to lead the 18th Episcopal District, which included Botswana, Lesotho, Mozambique, and Swaziland. Their five-year tenure in this role was characterized by extraordinary energy, empathy,

and integrity.

In 2021, the Wicker team went on to serve the 8th Episcopal District comprising of Louisiana and Mississippi. In their three-year tenure, the district became debt-free under Bishop Wicker's 8Cs Model Ministry.

On August 28th, 2024, during the 52nd Session of the African Methodist Episcopal Church's General Conference, Bishop and Supervisor Wicker were assigned to the 3rd Episcopal District. Bishop now serves as Chancellor of Wilberforce University and Chair of the Board of Trustees for Payne Theological Seminary.

Together, they are the proud parents of two daughters, Valencia M. Wicker and Lauren M. Wicker.



About Our Guest Preacher

Adam Jefferson Richardson, Jr. was elected and consecrated the 115th Bishop in the African Methodist Episcopal Church in 1996. He was assigned to the 14th Episcopal District, which includes six countries in West Africa. He has served as chair of the Lay Commission, the Health Commission, the Commission on Seminaries, Universities Colleges and Schools, and a member of the World Methodist Council. In 2002, Bishop Richardson was president of the Council of Bishops and Bishop of the 19th Episcopal District, headquartered in Johannesburg, South Africa. In 2004, he was assigned to the 2nd Episcopal District which includes Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina and Washington, DC. For eight years, the District saw phenomenal growth in nearly every category of ministry endeavor, with attention given to social justice and civic engagement. Bishop and Mrs. Richardson took pride in the embrace of youth and young adult ministry. In 2012, Bishop Richardson was elected president of the AMEC's General Board and was assigned to the Eleventh Episcopal District, Florida and the Commonwealth of the Bahamas. For nine years, he chaired the Board of Edward Waters University in Jacksonville.

Before his election to the Episcopacy, he was pastor of Bethel AME Church, Tallahassee. For eighteen years, the congregation saw numerical growth, the founding of the Bethel CDC, new and expanded facilities, outreach to the poor and dispossessed, with an active community presence. A ten-acre camp was acquired called Bethel-By-The-Lake. In honor of Bishop and Mrs. Richardson, the well-appointed recreational site was renamed Camp Richardson.

Bishop Richardson began his educational pursuit in the public schools of Tampa. He received the B.A. degree in Philosophy and Religion from Florida A&M University (where he was noted as the head drum major of the famed Marching '100' Band). He earned the Master of Divinity (M.Div) degree from Turner Seminary at the Interdenominational Theological Center and the Doctor of Sacred Theology (STD) degree at ITC through the Atlanta Theological jAssociation.

He has held faculty posts at the ITC, Morris Brown College in Atlanta, and adjunct instructor at FAMU. He was cited by Tallahassee Magazine as one of the most influential people of that city over the previous 15 years. Bishop Richardson has contributed articles in several publications, including: The African American Devotional Bible, 1997 (Conference of National Black Churches); Ain't That Good News, 1984 (Bishop G. G. M. Ingram, ed.); The Pastor's Manual of the AME Church (Dr. G. L. Champion, ed.). He has authored several manuals for discipleship training. In 2000, he published Headlines to Homilies: Sermons on Political, Commercial and Other Popular Annoyances. With a penchant for writing litanies, in 2012 he published, Let the Church Say Amen: Liturgy, Litany and Homily. In the wake of the massacre at Mother Emanuel in Charleston, he penned the widely circulated litany, The Doors of the Church are Still Open, and After the Vigil, Vigilance.

He is the recipient of honorary doctoral degrees from Bethune-Cookman University, Daytona Beach; Edward Waters University, Jacksonville; and Florida A&M University, Tallahassee. He has traveled to 58 countries and nation states. He and his wife of 55 years, Dr. Connie Speights, are the proud parents of Monique (an elected County Judge) and Trey (a radiographer with Master's degrees in Music Theory and Classical Saxophone Performance).

In 2021, Bishop Richardson was assigned to the 10th Episcopal District, embracing the great state of Texas and serves on the Board of the Conference of National Black Churches. He has also chaired Boards at the ITC and Paul Quinn College in Dallas, Texas. He was inducted to the prestigious Martin Luther King, Jr. Board of Preachers at Morehouse College. Now retired, he is the immediate past Senior Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church.

Rev. Teresa L. Fry Brown, PhD, is the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs (2022-present) and Bandy Professor of Preaching (2015-present) at Candler School of Theology at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia. Additionally, she served as the fourteenth Historiographer, the editor of the A.M.E. Review, Executive Director of Research and Scholarship from 2012 to 2024, and President of the General Officers' Council of the African Methodist Episcopal Church from 2021 to 2024. Dr. Fry Brown was Director of Black Church Studies at Candler (2007-2015). Dr. Fry Brown obtained a Doctor of Philosophy in Religious and Theological Studies from the Iliff School of Theology and the University of Denver, with an emphasis in Religion and Social Transformation (1996). She earned a Juris Masters (2025) Emory University School



of Law (Health Care Law, Policy, and Regulation), a Master of Divinity from Iliff School of Theology (1988), a Master of Science degree (1975) and a Bachelor of Science degree (1973) in Speech Pathology and Audiology from the University of Central Missouri in Warrensburg, Missouri.

Dr. Fry Brown has extensive experience in teaching and preaching in national, international, academic, and ecumenical settings. A prolific author, Dr. Fry Brown's books include Delivering the Sermon: Voice, Body and Animation in Proclamation, Fortress Press (2008); Can A Sister Get a Little Help: Advice and Encouragement for Black Women in Ministry, Pilgrim Press (2008); God Don't Like Ugly: African American Women Handing on Spiritual Values Abingdon Press (2000); Weary Throats and New Song: Black Women Proclaiming God's Word Abingdon Press (2003) and the 2006 African American History Devotional, Abingdon Press (2006). Additionally, she has published sixty other reviews, chapters, and commentaries.

Dr. Fry Brown is a member of the American Academy of Religion (Steering Committee of Womanist Approaches to Religion and Society Group 2018-2024), Society for the Study of Black Religion, and the Academy of Homiletics First Vice President (2021-2022; President, December 2022-2023). She was honored for her academic achievements at the Eighteenth Annual Black Religious Scholar Group Consultation at the American Academy of Religion (2015), Emory-Williams Distinguished Teaching Award (2017), Samuel Dewitt Proctor Beautiful Are the Feet Award (2019), and Turner Theological Seminary Lifetime Achievement Award (2021). She is an ordained Itinerant Elder in the African Methodist Episcopal Church and an Associate Minister at New Bethel A.M.E. Church, Lithonia, Georgia.

A native of Independence, Missouri, Dr. Fry Brown is the second oldest of seven children of (late) William M. Fry Sr. and (late) Naomi Parks Fry. She is the mother of Veronica Perry and a proud "Fab G" to Jonathan David Perry. She is a member of the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.

The words of the Prophet Isaiah guide Dr. Fry Brown's life: "Those whose hope is in the Lord gain new strength," and Zora Neale Hurston's words, "There are years that ask questions and years that answer."

BIOS OF AME3'S PASTOR OF THE YEAR AND RETIREES

PASTOR OF THE YEAR

Reverend David Ellery Wade, son of the late Luther Edward Wade Sr. and Nancy Mann Jackson Wade, is 64 years of age and has been married to Latisha Phenice Wade, his wonderful wife, for seven years.

They reside in Huntington, WV, and have five (5) children, nine (9) grandchildren, and one (1) great-grandchild. He and his wife are lifelong members of Young Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Huntington, WV, where he has been the lead pastor for two years.

Reverend Wade is a graduate of Marshall University with a Regents Bachelor of Arts Degree. David is a 4-year Lettermen at Marshall University where he played basketball and is in the Marshall University Athletic Hall of Fame.

Reverend Wade received his license to preach as a Licentiate in the African Methodist Episcopal Church on March 11, 2017; and was ordained as an Itinerant Deacon on November 11, 2021.

He is a member of the Board of Examiners Ministerial Institute and proudly received his Master of Divinity degree, graduating Cum Laude from Payne Theological Seminary on May 9, 2025. He is scheduled to be robed an Itinerant Elder by Bishop Wicker Stafford on Friday, November 1, 2025.

His favorite passages of scripture for years has been Psalm 27:4 "One thing I ask from the LORD, this only do I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze on the beauty of the LORD and to seek him in his temple"; along with Proverbs 27:17 "As Iron sharpens Iron, so one person sharpens another", but due to recent life trials with illness and health, Reverend Wade has shifted his favorite scripture to Isaiah 40:31. "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles: they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not be faint". Reverend Wade also enjoys ministering through song and has written and produced many songs. He is most proud of his songs "I Wanna Thank you Momma" and "My God will see you through".

RETIREES

Rev. Victor L. Davis, pastor, teach, and activist, was born in the city of Hamilton Ohio. He is the son of Charles and Alluster Tipton and is one of 10 children. He attended Hamilton City schools and

graduated from Garfield Senior high school where he was on the football and track team. He was also the president of Black Student Union. His student activism started in school when he led walkouts his junior and senior year. Upon graduating from high school, he attended Central State University of Ohio and was elected to the student senate and dorm council. During his freshman year, he led his dormitory in soliciting and accomplishing the first open visitation for Hughes Hall dormitory. After singing in the choir for over twenty years and serving as a trustee, Rev. Davis answered the call to preach in 1996 under the pastorate of the Rev. Elmer S. Martin at Payne Chapel AME church in Hamilton Ohio. He was licensed by Presiding Elder William Gazaway. He was ordained a Deacon under Bishop Henry A. Belin, Jr. Bishop Robert V. Webster appointed him to his first church, Delaney Chapel Georgetown, Ohio.

In addition to being a pastor, Rev. Davis is a trainer and motivational speaker having provided training throughout Ohio and the region. Davis has earned several awards: Booker T. Washington Community Center "Hall of Fame", South East Civic Association "Advocacy Award", South East Civic Association: "Walk of Fame", University of Cincinnati "Black Man Think Tank Pyramid Award".

Rev. Davis is married to Roxanne Davis and the proud parents of daughters Shani and Rashida, nine grandchildren, three great grandchildren, a special granddaughter and two special grandchildren.

Rev. Jacqueline L. Randolph

Pastor Randolph was licensed in 1992, and ordained several years later. She was born, rooted, scolded and molded for God's service in New North Street AME Church. She is the longest serving Pastor of that church, and has been there from birth until retirement at age 75.

She would tell you her education isn't steeped in degrees. Experience has been her teacher, thriving even when the odds were against her.

Pastor Randoph completed the ATEP program under Rev. Dr. Charles Holmes. She also has an Associate of Theology, Diploma in Christian Counseling, and a Bachelors of Pastoral Ministry from Kingsway Theological Seminary.

Her life motto is: "If I can help somebody

as I pass along, then my living will not be in vain.".

Favorite scripture: Psalm 27 "The Lord is my light and my salvation, whom shall I fear, the Lord is the strength of my life, of whom shall I be afraid."

Rev. Dwight E. Smith

Rev. Dwight E. Smith's faith formation began in the African Methodist Episcopal Church at an early age, attending Coppin Chapel AMEC in Indianapolis. He was a member of the YPD and regularly attended Sunday School and Church School Conventions.

Smith later hesitated to answer his formal call to ministry, because of the belief that he could never be good enough to serve and share the Good News of Jesus Christ. That changed when he heard a sermon preached at a Church School Convention about God's Grace.

Rev. Smith's secular career was in broadcast journalism. He was a television reporter and worked in several cities, including Indianapolis, Baltimore and Dayton, Ohio.

One week after moving his wife and two young boys to Louisville, the broadcast company where he was to be employed went up for sale. His position was eliminated. Even through unemployment, the Smith Family never went hungry and never missed a mortgage payment. There must be a God somewhere! Upon returning to Dayton, Rev. Smith answered his call to ministry at Wayman AMEC.

Psalm 37:25 became his "signature scripture": "I once was young and now I am old, but I have never seen the righteous forsaken nor his seed, go begging for food."

Rev. Smith was ordained by Bishop Henry A. Belin, Jr.

He earned degrees from Indiana University, University of Dayton and Payne Theological Seminary in Wilberforce, before working 15 years for Premier Health as a staff chaplain in Troy, Ohio and Dayton Ohio.

Over his 27-year ministry, Smith was the proud pastor of St. Paul AME Church Cedarville, Trinity AMEC in Springfield, and Central Chapel AMEC Yellow Springs, Ohio.

"Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly. I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. (John 10:1-16)

The Act of Ordination of Elders

Elder ordinands return to the altar. Then shall the bishop examine every one that is to be ordained, in the presence of the people, in the following manner:

BISHOP: Have always, therefore, printed in your remembrance how great treasure is committed to your charge. For they are the sheep of Christ which he bought with his death, and for whom he shed his blood. The church and congregation, whom you must serve, are his Spouse, and his Body. And if it should happen the same church or any member thereof, do take any hurt or hindrance by reason of your negligence, you know the greatness of the fault, and also the horrible punishment that will ensue. Wherefore consider within yourselves the end of the ministry towards the children of God, towards the Spouse and Body of Christ, and see that you never cease your labor, your care, and diligence until you have done all that lies in you, according to your bounden duty, to bring all such as are or shall be committed to your charge unto that agreement in the faith, and to that ripeness and perfectness of age in Christ, that there may be no place left among you, either for error in religion or for viciousness in life.

BISHOP: Forasmuch then as your office is both of so great excellence, and of so great difficulty, you see with how great awe and study you ought to apply yourselves, as neither you yourselves offend, nor be occasion that others offend. Howbeit ye cannot have a mind and will thereunto yourselves for that will and ability are given of God alone; therefore, you ought, and have need, to pray earnestly for His Holy Spirit. And seeing that you cannot by any other means compass the doing of so weighty a work pertaining to the salvation of people, with doctrine and exhortation taken out of the Holy Scriptures, and with a life agreeable to the same, consider how studious you ought to be in reading and learning the Scriptures and in framing the manners both of yourselves and of them that specially pertain to you, according to the rules of the same Scriptures; and for this self-same cause how you ought to forsake and set aside as much as you may all worldly care and studies.

Have always, therefore, printed in your remembrance how great treasure is committed to your charge. For they are the sheep of Christ which he bought with his death, and for whom he shed his blood. The church and congregation, whom you must serve, are his Spouse, and his Body. And if it should happen the same church or any member thereof, do take any hurt or hindrance by reason of your negligence, you know the greatness of the fault, and also the horrible punishment that will ensue. Wherefore consider within yourselves the end of the ministry towards the children of God, towards the Spouse and Body of Christ, and see that you never cease your labor, your care, and diligence until you have done all that lies in you, according to your bounden duty, to bring all such as are or shall be committed to your charge unto that agreement in the faith, and to that ripeness and perfectness of age in Christ, that there may be no place left among you, either for error in religion or for viciousness in life.

The Act of Ordination of Elders

We have good hope that you have all weighed and pondered these things with yourselves long before this time; and that you have clearly determined by God's grace to give yourselves to this office whereby it has pleased God to call you, so that as much as lies within you, you will apply yourselves wholly to this one thing and draw all your cares and studies this way, and that you will continually pray to God the Father by the

mediation of our only Savior Jesus Christ, of the heavenly assistance of the Holy Spirit; that by daily reading and weighing of the Scripture you may wax riper and stronger in your ministry, and that you may so endeavor yourselves, from time to time, to sanctify the lives of you and yours, and to fashion them after the rule and doctrine of Christ that you may be wholesome and goodly examples and patterns for the people to follow.

And now that this present congregation of Christ here assembled may also understand your minds and wills in these things, and that this your promise may the more move you to do your duties, you shall answer plainly to these things which we, in the name of God and his Church, shall demand of you touching the same.

BISHOP: Do you think in your heart that you are truly called, according to the will of

our Lord Jesus Christ, to the order of elder?

Candidate: I do so believe.

BISHOP: Are you persuaded that the Holy Scriptures contain sufficiently all

doctrines required of necessity for eternal salvation through faith in Jesus Christ? Are you determined out of the said Scriptures to instruct the people committed to your charge, and to teach nothing, as required of necessity to salvation, but that which you shall be persuaded may be conducted and

proved by Scriptures?

Candidate: I am so persuaded, and have so determined by God's grace.

BISHOP: Will you then give faithful diligence always so to minister the doctrine and

sacraments and discipline of Christ as the Lord hath commanded?

Candidate: I will do so, by the help of the Lord.

BISHOP: Will you be ready with faithful diligence always to banish and drive away

all erroneous and strange doctrines contrary to God's Word, and to use both public and private monitions and exhortations as well to the sick as to the whole within your charge as need shall require and occasion shall be

given?

Candidate: I will, the Lord being my helper.

according to the doctrine of Christ and to make both yourselves and them, as much as in you lies, wholesome examples and patterns to the flock of

Candidate: I shall apply myself thereto, the Lord being my helper.

the charge and government over you, following with a glad mind and will their godly admonitions, submitting yourselves to their godly judgments?

Candidate: I will do so, the Lord being my helper.

Then shall the Bishop say:

Almighty God, who has given you this will to do all these things, grant also unto you strength and power to perform the same, that He may accomplish His work, which He has begun, through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

After which shall be said by the bishop (the persons to be ordained elders all kneeling), Veni Creator Spiritus (Latin: Come, Creator Spirit), the bishop beginning and the elders and others that are present answering by verse as follows:

And lighten with celestial fire; Response: **BISHOP:** Thou the anointing Spirit art,

Almighty God, Heavenly Father, who of your infinite love and goodness towards us has given us your only and most dearly beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to be our Redeemer and the author of everlasting life; who, after he had made perfect our redemption by his death and was ascended into the heaven, sent abroad into the world his apostles, prophets, evangelists, teachers, and pastors by whose labor and ministry he gathered together a great flock in all parts of the world, to set forth the eternal praise of your holy name; for these so great benefits of your eternal goodness, and for that you have vouchsafed to call these your servants here present to the same office and ministry appointed for the salvation of mankind, we render to you most hearty thanks; we praise and worship you,

and we humbly beseech you by your same blessed Son to grant to all, who either here or elsewhere call upon your name, that we may continue to show ourselves thankful to you of these and all your other benefits, and that we may daily increase and go forward in the knowledge and faith of you and your Son, by the Holy Spirit. So that as well by these your ministers as by them over whom they shall be appointed your ministers that your holy name may be forever glorified and your blessed kingdom enlarged through the same, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in unity of the same Holy Spirit, world without end. Amen.

After this prayer, the bishop with seven elders present shall lay their hands severally upon the head of everyone who receives the order of elder, the receivers humbly kneeling upon their knees, and the bishop saying:

BISHOP: The Lord pour upon you the Holy Spirit for the office and work of an elder in the Church of God, now committed to you by the imposition of our hands. Be a faithful dispenser of the Word of God and of His holy sacraments in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Bishop shall deliver to each of them kneeling the Bible into his or her hands, saying:

BISHOP: Take thou authority to preach the word of God and to administer the holy sacrament in the congregation in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The Bishop shall go on with the service of the Communion, which all they who receive orders shall take together and remain in the same place where hands were laid upon them until such time as they have received the Communion.
